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WORLD COMMITTEE OF THE PAN-ARMENIAN GAMES

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1. Basic Provisions

The following Regulation of the Pan-Armenian Summer Games (hereinafter as "games") clarifies in detail the provisions relating to games. It includes the games program, tournaments rules, the procedure and terms of submission the accreditation applications for participating in games, the opening and closing ceremonies of the games, provisions regarding the rights of use and advertising of games symbols, as well as other comments.

2. Participants of the Games

2.1. The cities' national teams and individual athletes participate in the Games.

2.2. All citizens holding Armenian national passports can participate in the Games.

2.3. A citizen of any country may participate in the Games if he/she:

- has an Armenian origin by father's and mother's sides
- has an Armenian origin only by father's side
- has an Armenian origin only by mother's side
- has taken the surname of the Armenian spouse after the marriage.

Heads of city sports delegations are responsible for complying with the aforementioned rules.

2.4. To prove the justification for inclusion the athlete as part of the city sports delegation, the participant must have a national passport or a permanent residence permit in the country (eg. the so-called "Green Card"), where is the city having the willingness to participate in the Games.

Note: The above-mentioned provisions do not apply to coaches and referees.

3. Age Restrictions

3.1. There is no age restrictions for the participants of the Games, except the cases when it is required by the rules of the International Sports Federations.

4. Medical Insurance

4.1. Each athlete participates in the games with a sense of individual responsibility and risk consciousness.

4.2. The participants of the games are required to have an Insurance Certificate with them for the entire duration of the games.

5. The Terms And Conditions of Admission of Applications for Accreditation

5.1. Initial applications for participation in the Games is required to submit the WCPAG Secretariat until January 31 of the year of the Games by specifying sports, tournaments (women and men separately) and number of participants.

5.2. Final nominee accreditation applications must be submitted by April 30 of the year of the Games. Accreditation applications will be considered as void if submitted after the deadline.

5.3 Exemptions can only be discussed and admitted by the WCPAG Executive Committee.

6. Eligibility

Each member of the city delegation who is eligible to participate in the games receives a badge.

7. Program of the Games and Rules of Tournaments

7.1. The Pan-Armenian Games' Program includes 17 sports: athletics, badminton, arm-wrestling, basketball, golf, tennis, swimming, beach volleyball, handball, cycling, shooting, mini football, chess, table tennis, dancesport dances, volleyball, football.

7.2. Table tennis tournaments are individual and team competitions.

7.3. Athletics, badminton, arm-wrestling, golf, tennis, swimming, cycling, shooting, chess and dancesport dances are individual competitions.

7.4. Tournaments are held by the rules of the International Federation of the relevant sport including the amendments made by the WCPAG Executive Committee.

Team Line-Up And the Number of Participants

8.1. Athletics (women and men).

The program includes 27 athletic contests - 13 for women and 14 for men.

Women: 100m, 200m, 400m, 800m and 1500m, transmission running - 4 x 100 m and 4 x 400 m, triple jump, high jump, long jump, discus throw, javelin throw, shot put.

Men: 100m, 200m, 400m, 800m, 1500m and 5000m, transmission running - 4 x 100 m and 4 x 400 m, triple jump, high jump, long jump, discus throw, javelin throw, shot put.

The reckoning is conducted according to the athletes with the two best results from each city.

8.2 Badminton (women and men).

The program includes 2 individual in-pair competitions between women and men.

Main network (women) includes 32 athletes (no more than 8 athletes from Armenian cities) and men 64 athletes (no more than 16 athletes from Armenian cities).

16 pairs of men and women will be included in the in-pair games network.

8.3 Arm Wrestling (women and men).

Individual competitions are held for men and women.

Men: 3 weight categories with right and left hands up to 70 kg, 90 kg and +90 kg.

Women: 2 weight categories with right and left hands up to 70 kg and +70 kg.

8.4 Basketball (women and men).

The team consists of 15 participants, including 12 athletes and 3 responsible persons.

8.5 Golf (women and men).

Individual competitions are held for men and women.

8.6 Tennis (women and men).

Single and in-pair games are held for men and women.

The main network includes 64 athletes (no more than 16 athletes from the cities of Armenia) and 32 athletes (no more than 8 athletes from the cities of Armenia).

In the in-pair games network are included up to 16 best men's and women's pairs.

8.7. Swimming (women and men).

The program includes 24 races, 12 for women and 12 for men.

Women: freestyle - 50m and 100m, breaststroke - 50m and 100m, transitional swimming in freestyle - 4 x 50 m and 4 x 100 m, combined transitional swimming - 4 x 100 m, butterfly - 50m and 100m, backstroke swimming - 50 m and 100 m, complex - 200 m.

Men: freestyle - 50 m and 100 m, breaststroke - 50m and 100m, transitional swimming in freestyle - 4 x 50 m and 4 x 100 m, combined transitional swimming - 4 x 100 m, butterfly - 50m and 100m, backstroke swimming - 50 m and 100 m, complex - 200 m.

The reckoning is based on the two best results of the athletes from each city.

8.8. Beach Volleyball (Women and Men)

Team line-up: 3 participants, including 2 athletes and 1 responsible person.

8.9. *Handball* (men)

Team line-up: 16 participants, including 14 athletes and 2 responsible persons.

8.10. *Cycling* (men and women).

Individual and group competitions are held for men and women.

Individual: 15km (Aknalich)

Group: 50km

8.11. *Shooting* (women and men).

Individual competitions are held for men and women.

Women: revolver - 10m (40 shots), rifle - 10m (40 shots)

Men: revolver - 10m (60 shots), rifle - 10m (60 shots)

The number of participants from Armenia is determined by the National Federation of the relevant Sport in coordination with the WCPAG Executive Committee.

8.12. *Mini-Football*

Team line-up: 15 participants, including 12 athletes and 3 responsible person: [1]

8.13. *Chess* (women and men).

Individual competitions are held for men and women.

Contestants must have a professional rating not exceeding 2300 points. The competitions are held according to the Swiss system.

8.14. *Table Tennis* (women and men).

Team competitions, single and in-pair games are held for men and women.

No more than 16 teams are allowed to participate in team competitions (3 athlete in each).

The main network includes 64 athletes (no more than 16 athletes from the cities of Armenia).

Up to 16 best pairs of men and women will be included in the list of in-pair games.

8.15. *DanceSport Dances* (women and men).

Individual and in-pair competitions are held for women.

The following forms are included in the competition program:

5 European Forms: Slow and Fast Waltz, Tango, Fast Foxtrot or Quickstep.

5 Latin American forms: Samba, Rumba, Cha-Cha, Pasodoble, Jive.

8.16. Volleyball (women and men).

Team line-up: 15 participants, including 12 athletes and 3 responsible persons.

8.17. Football (men).

Team line-up: 21 participants, including 18 athletes and 3 responsible persons.

The preliminary and quarter-final matches are held 2 half x 35 minutes duration, semifinal matches: 2 half x 40 minutes duration, and the final match is 2 half x 45 minutes duration.

Six changes are allowed to make during the game. [2]

10. Games Opening Ceremony

10.1. Delegations from participating cities are passing after the relevant poster with the city name (in Armenian and English) and the city flag.

Parade participants are not allowed to carry the national flag of the country instead of or together with the city flag.

Athletes may have small national flags, the size of which should not exceed 20 cm.

10.2. Participants may wear T-shirt with symbols of city, Pan-Armenian Games and Sponsors.

10.3. On behalf of all athletes, the athlete from Diaspora, and on behalf of all referees, the referee from Armenia are raising their right hand to swear:

“On behalf of all participants, I swear that we will participate in the Pan-Armenian Games respecting and abiding by the current sports rules, according to the sporting spirit, for the sake of sport's worth, participating cities, the Armenian people and our homeland, the Mother Armenia's glory. ”

“On behalf of all the referees, I swear to judge these games absolutely impartial, respecting and abiding by the current sports rules, according to the sporting spirit, for the sake of sport's worth, participating cities, the Armenian people and our homeland, the Mother Armenia's glory. ”

The swearing athlete and the referee should be elected by the WCPAG Executive Committee.

11. Awarding Ceremony for the winners of the games

11.1. The awarding ceremony for the Prize Winners by sports takes place immediately after the end of the competition. The winners are awarded accordingly medals and diplomas, female winners are also given flowers:

11.2. Hereby, is the number of medals the winners of the games are awarded by taking into account the number of team members in different sports.

11.3 Cup Winners

Pan-Armenian Games Cups are awarded the winning teams in football, mini-football, handball, basketball, volleyball, beach volleyball and table tennis, as well as, transmission running and transmission swimming (women and men, except the first three sports).

Special cups are awarded the laureates of tournaments: "For The Best Delegation," For The Fair Game", "For The Athletic Spirit And Patience", " Pan-Armenian Games Revelation ", "Pan-Armenian Games Beauty".

[1] Those athletes who have a professional license are not allowed to participate at the football tournament of the Games. Exception: professional athletes who are age 46 and older.

[2] Those athletes who have a professional license are not allowed to participate at the football tournament of the Games. Exception: professional athletes who are age 36 and older.
